Dear Parents,

Your child is learning that the letters *k* and *ck* at the end of a word (or syllable) sound exactly the same. It's important to learn which to use. We're also working on the sound-alike spellings *ch* and *tch*. Again, it's important to know which is right. This will help, though there are exceptions to each rule:

- Spell it *ck* if it follows a short vowel.
- Spell it *k* (or *ke*) if it does not follow a short vowel.
- Spell it *tch* if it follows a short vowel.
- Spell it *ch* if it does not follow a short vowel.

Help your child apply these spelling rules to sort the words in this activity. First, discuss the directions with your child. Then guide your child through the activity, letting your child do as much as possible without your help. Notice that there is one extra blank to be filled for each spelling pattern. Help your child fill in this blank. Then check each word against the rule it illustrates.

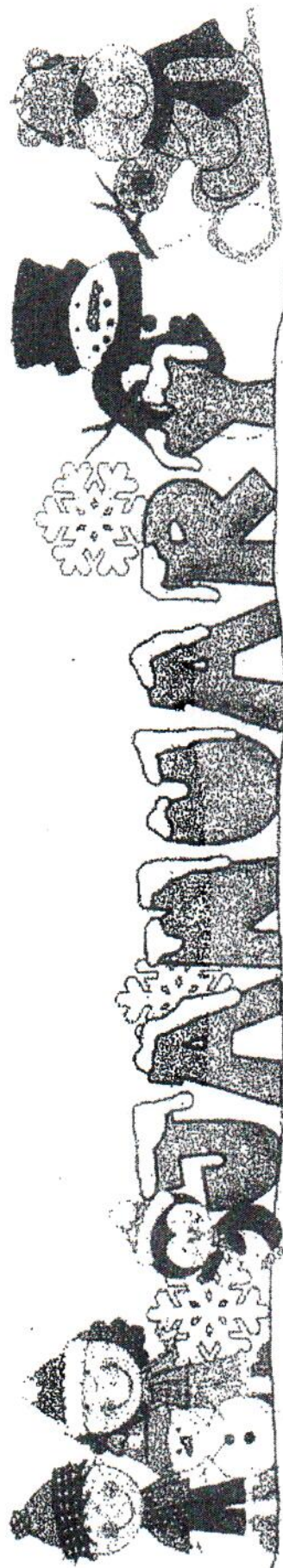
