ELA/Writing

This month we will be reading Click, Clack, Moo: Cows That Type, Ah, Music and Schools Around the World. We will be working on the comprehension strategies: Drawing Conclusions, Text and Graphic Features, and Main Idea and Details. We will also continue to work on Narrative Writing and start our All About writing pieces.

Math

We will be starting Unit 4 which will focus on place value and measurement. Topics will include telling time using analog and digital clocks and how to use A.M. and P.M. We will review comparing two humbers. Place value will also be used to explain a digit's position and value in a humber. For example, the 5 in 52 is the tens place and has a value of 50. We will learn to estimate and measure using inches, centimeters and feet.
